• OBJECTIVES OF TRAVEL

- A. To conduct and participate in the July 11 FAEA Board Meeting
- B. To meet with US Codex office, USTR, FAS/Washington, and FAS/Field staff to discuss FAEA strategies/activities in FAEA target markets

• KEY OBSERVATIONS AND CONCLUSIONS

Both of the above objectives were met.

- A. **FAEA Board Meeting**: The Board meeting was held at the Hilton Hotel in McLean, VA on July 11, 2023. The meeting was attended by all members. Representatives from the American Feed Industry Association (AFIA) and Foreign Agriculture Service also participated in the meeting. Most of the time was devoted to reviewing and discussing the FAEA strategic plan. This effort was led by the contractor hired by the FAEA to help develop the strategic plan.
- B. US Codex Office, USTR, FAS/Washington and FAS/Field Staff Meetings: FAEA board members along with the FAEA staff met with USTR and FAS senior management to introduce themselves to USTR and the FAS leadership. FAEA staff met with several FAS staff based in Washington and overseas offices. FAS Field staff covered Bangladesh, Cambodia, China, Senegal, and Vietnam.

• KEY RECOMMENDATIONS:

A. FAEA Board Recommendations and Action Items:

(1) The strategic plan presentation went well. Revisions were made as a result of the discussions with the Board members. The contractor will update the plan and submit to FAEA by the end of July. FAEA must review the updated plan and decide what steps should be taken to complete the strategic planning process.

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- (2) FAEA Executive Director will travel to China in August to assess whether FAEA should re-engage with Chinese regulatory officials to conduct activities there, and also identify potential private sector organizations to collaborate with in China.
- (3) FAEA must issue an RFP to hire a new Executive Director (ED) starting January 1, 2024. The goal is to select the new ED before the next Board meeting in November.
- (4) FAEA must discuss and decide whether to increase member dues at the next Board meeting.

B. Recommendations and Conclusions from meetings with FAS staff:

- (1) FAEA staff will continue to collaborate with FAS on a number of food and feed safety capacity building programs, in particular in Kenya, Nigeria, and Bangladesh.
- (2) FAEA needs to re-engage with Cambodia since the FAS program there has expired, there is a new FAS staff member at the Embassy in Phnom Penh, and Cambodia just passed its new food safety law in June 2022 and could use help in implementing it.

DAILY ACTIVITY

Monday, July 10, 2023

All FAEA team members arrived in McLean, VA on July 10. Mr. Sisson from Bethany Beach, DE; Ms. Nababan, from Fullerton, CA; and Ms. Kishore from Silver Spring, MD. All three stayed at the Hilton McLean Tysons Corner in McLean (the venue for the USAEDC Attache´ Seminar)

- 1. US Codex Office (USCO) meeting with Rita Kishore in the USDA south Building
 - The USCO is supportive of FAEA work in Bangladesh. They want Bangladesh to be more active in Codex meetings.
 - We discussed the possible visit of Government officials from Cambodia to the US. USCO stated that they would be willing to talk to them.
 - USCO informed us that the Government of Nigeria does not lack money but lacks organizational skills.
 - USCO will organize a colloquium in Asia, Africa, and Latin America in November 2023
 - Pakistan does not attend Codex meetings.
- 2. FAEA staff meeting with Contractor, Ms. Melissa Kessler in the hotel lobby The FAEA Executive Director (Mr. Sisson), Program Coordinator (Ms. Nababan), and Codex Coordinator (Ms. Kishore) discussed the strategic plan with the contractor Ms. Melissa Kessler. They visited the meeting room to discuss the seating arrangements and set up the room with materials and props that the contractor will use for her discussion.

Tuesday, July 11, 2023

1. FAEA July Board Meeting

The meeting was conducted at the Hilton McLean Tysons Corner. All members participated either via zoom or in person in this meeting. The meeting started at 7:30 AM and adjourned at 11:30 AM. See Appendix 1 for the Board meeting agenda.

Most of the meeting was devoted to a discussion of the FAEA strategic plan led by Ms. Melissa Kessler who was the consultant hired by FAEA to plan, prepare and draft the plan. Ms. Kessler did an excellent job of leading the Board to fill in some of the gaps of information still needed to complete the plan. She was also successful in getting the Board to develop consensus around some of the key issues including criteria for selecting target markets, the process for selecting FAEA Chair and Vice Chairs. Other issues that will be addressed at the next meeting were identified and it was agreed that more work would need to be made to finalize and begin implementing some of the key elements of the plan. Ms. Kessler will submit a final copy of the plan to FAEA by the end of July with recommendations for next steps. The final copy of the plan accompanies this report as a separate document.



The final hour of the meeting was devoted to the usual Board meeting activity updates, financial situation, and other business including:

- Next steps in Strategic Planning process
- Process and timing for selecting the new FAEA Executive Director
- FAEA Membership Dues
- Process for selection of the FAEA Chair and Vice Chair

Wednesday July 12, 2023

1. Meetings with FAS and USTR (see Appendix 2 for the Meeting Schedule)

a. Meeting with Senior FAS Managers

- Mr. Whitley welcomed the FAEA representatives to USDA and started the meeting with introductions.
- Mr. Sutter shared general information about FAEA FAEA has nine members whose organizations represented 51 percent of total US ag exports to the world in 2022.



- FAEA is active in Bangladesh, China, Cambodia, Kenya, and Nigeria and monitoring the situation in Vietnam, Ghana, and Pakistan to consider programs there.
- The broad goal of FAEA is to enhance cooperation among commodity groups and private organizations in developing export markets through reduced sanitary and phytosanitary (SPS) constraints for the benefit of U.S. agriculture in general and of the U.S. grain-oilseeds-animal sectors in particular.
- FAEA thanked FAS (Washington and FAS field office staff) for their many collaborations with them and several successes in the FAEA activities over the last few years. FAEA requested continued support and collaboration, specifically for new activities that we are planning for Kenya and Cambodia this year.
- FAEA stated that in Kenya, USTR requested FAEA to stop engagement with the Kenyan Gov't food and feed safety regulatory officials (FAEA has done work with Kenya over the last three years). The reason for this is because USTR is now conducting STIP (Strategic Trade and Investment Partnership) negotiations with Kenya. FAEA proposed to USTR that FAEA engage with the Kenyan private sector in a food safety strategic planning workshop to hear about their challenges with the existing food and feed safety standards and regulations. USTR has not yet responded to this proposal. We'll let FAS know about the outcome of our meeting. FAEA also requested that FAS talk to USTR on our behalf.
- Cambodia- passed a new Law on Food Safety one year ago. Cambodians accepted FAEA offer of two activities to assist them in implementing their new law. The first would be a study tour to Washington, DC in late October for a team of Cambodian regulatory officials. This would include meetings with USTR, USDA, FDA, EPA, and others so the team can learn how the US regulations of food and feed safety. The second activity is a Food Safety Strategic Planning Workshop in Phnom Penh in December. For both these activities FAEA welcomes FAS participation and would appreciate having a point of contact at FAS who would help us coordinate meetings and presentations with the appropriate FAS officials. Mr. Whitley stated that he supports both these activities.

Ambassador Doug McKalip welcomed the FAEA team to the USTR. Mr. Jim Sutter gave a brief overview of FAEA activities. Collaboration and support from USTR has been very important to the success of FAEA activities in the past, for example in Kenya and Nigeria. He thanked USTR for their continued support and collaboration during the past years. He also requested continued support and collaboration, specifically for new activities that we are planning for Kenya and Cambodia this year.

- Kenya USTR requested that FAEA not engage with the Kenyan Gov't food and feed safety regulatory officials that FAEA worked with over the past three years. FAEA proposed engagement with the Kenyan private sector in a food safety strategic planning workshop and requested an USTR response. Ambassador McKalip said that he will discuss it with his staff and get back to the FAEA staff.
- Cambodia passed a new Law on Food Safety one year ago. Cambodians accepted FAEA offer of two activities to assist them in implementing their new law. For both these activities FAEA welcomes USTR participation and would appreciate having a point of contact at USTR who would help us coordinate meetings and presentations with the appropriate USTR officials. Ambassador Doug McKalip stated that he supports both these activities and David Jankowski will be the USTR point of contact.

2. Meeting with FAS Bangladesh

Ms. Sarah Gilleski

Ms. Gilleski will start her rotation in Bangladesh in August 2023. Mr. Sisson, Ms. Nababan and Ms. Kishore provided her with an overview of FAEA and its activities in Bangladesh.



We told her about the Codex workshop that we conducted with Venture37 in May 2023. Ms. Gilleski stated that once in Bangladesh she will get back to us about any other activities that she thinks would be of interest.

3. Meeting with FAS Senegal

Mr. Wright will start his rotation in Senegal in August 2023. Mr. Sisson, Ms. Nababan and Ms. Kishore provided him with an overview of FAEA activities. We also explained that Senegal is an important market to almost all members of the FAEA board. Mr. Wright stated that once he goes to Senegal, he will assess the situation and get back to us to discuss the projects that would be of mutual interest to FAS and FAEA

He shared his itinerary and made an appointment to meet the FAS team in Beijing. The FAS China team was very supportive of the FAEA visit to China and FAEA meetings with various government and private offices there.

3. Meeting with FAS/Vietnam and Cambodia

Mr. Andrew Anderson-Sprecher and Mr. James Yi

Mr. Anderson-Sprecher will start his rotation in Vietnam in August 2023. The FAS Vietnam office also covers Cambodia. We explained our two proposed projects in Cambodia. Cambodians have accepted the FAEA offer of two activities to assist them in implementing their new law. The first will be a study tour to Washington, DC in late October for a team of Cambodian regulatory officials. This will include meetings with USTR, USDA, FDA, EPA, and others so the team can learn how the US regulates its food and feed safety regime. The second activity is a Food Safety Strategic Planning Workshop in Phnom Penh in December. Mr. Anderson-Sprecher was verry supportive of both projects and will get back to us about as soon as he can about the next steps in planning and how he and FAS Cambodia can assist.


